
SRI SATHYA SAI UNIVERSITY FOR HUMAN EXCELLENCE


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

FOUNDER'S MESSAGE

Cardinal Anthony Poola Cardinal – Catholic Church, India

nthony Poola, Archbishop of Hyderabad, was named by Pope Francis as one amongst the new Cardinals of the Catholic Church. He is the first Dalit from Andhra Pradesh to have been elevated to the rank of the Cardinal, which is Γ considered as the second biggest title after the Pope.

Anthony Poola hails from Kurnool district of Andhra Pradesh. He led the diocese of Kurnool for over 12 years before being appointed as Archbishop of Hyderabad in 2020 by Pope Francis. He had also served as the Chairman of the Youth Commission Telugu Region and Telugu Catholic Bishops Council's treasurer.


SPEAKERS



Dr Hafeezur Rahman Founder President – Sufi Peace Foundation, India

r Hafeezur Rahman is a well-known Islamic and Sufi scholar. He obtained his PhD of Philosophy in the field of Sufi studies. Currently, he serves as a visiting faculty in the Centre of Persian and Central Asian Studies in Jawaharlal Nehru University (JNU), Delhi.

Dr Hafeezur Rahman is the founder of Sufi Peace Foundation, a non-profit organisation that works towards the promotion of sustainable development in the areas of art and culture, health and nutrition, human rights, minorities, vocational training, etc. In his book, 'Rumi – The Guide and Philosopher', he explains the role of Rumi as a Theologian and a Qur'an Commentator, and the reason for his influence on Sufi orders in South Asia. As a promoter of interfaith harmony, Dr Hafeezur Rahman participated in international conferences at the UNESCO headquarters in Paris (France), Turkey, Iran, Iraq and Kyrgyzstan, and several cities in India.



Dharmacharya Shantum Seth Co-Founder – Ahimsa Trust, India (Representative of Master Thich Naht Hanh)

hantum Seth is an ordained Dharmacharya (Dharma Teacher) in the Buddhist Mindfulness lineage of the Zen Master, Thich Nhat Hanh, who teaches in \checkmark India and across the world. He has been leading pilgrimages called 'In the Footsteps of the Buddha' and other multi-faith, educational, cultural, spiritual and transformative journeys across diverse regions of India and Asia since 1988.

He is actively involved in educational, social and ecological sectors, with the prime objective to cultivate mindfulness in society, especially with the educators, the Central Reserve Police Force and the corporate sector, amongst others.

He is considered the foremost guide at those sites which are associated with the Buddha and has trained tour guides for UNESCO and the Government of India, while also being accredited as an official guide for them. He calls himself a cultural interpreter, and enjoys sharing with the world, the subtleties of India's religions, society, economy and politics with those who are interested in understanding the mind of India.



Dr Sarina Molina Associate Dean - University of San Diego, United States of America

r Sarina Chugani Molina received her Bachelor's and Master's degrees from the University of Hawai'i in East Asian Languages and Literature with a minor in comparative religions. She earned her Doctorate degree from the University of San Diego in Leadership Studies with a specialisation in character education. She currently serves as Associate Dean and Associate Professor at the School of Leadership in Education Sciences in the University of San Diego, where she guides the PhD students in Education for Social Justice Programme and provides administrative oversight and support for faculty and students. She has been a teacher and teacher educator for over 25 years, and has authored publications on language teacher development, pedagogy, transnational identity, family, school, community engagement, and English language education and social inequality. She has also served as a facilitator for mindfulness workshops for educators, education in human values and spiritual education programmes for children.



Joint President - World Congress of Faiths, United Kingdom

abbi Jackie Tabick was born in Dublin and grew up in the community of South West Essex and Settlement Reform Synagogue. After reading Medieval History for her degree at University College London, she enrolled at the Leo Baeck College where she completed her rabbinical training. She graduated to become Britain's first female Rabbi in 1975.

Starting her rabbinical career as the assistant Rabbi at West London Synagogue under Rabbi Hugo Gryn until 1998, she further moved on to become the Rabbi of North West Surrey Synagogue and served there until July 2013. At the same time, since 2012, she has held a position as the first female Convenor of the Reform Movement's *Beit Din*. (A *Beit Din* is a rabbinical court of Judaism). She was previously the Vice-President of Movement for Reform Judaism.

Rabbi Jackie is currently the Convenor for the European Union of Progressive Judaism's Beit Din and a patron of the Jewish Council for Racial Equality (JCORE). She has played a leading role in interfaith initiatives, and is an executive of the Interfaith Network.

Ms Gitaniali J B Co-Founder, CEO and Dean – Himalayan Institute of Alternatives, India

multi-talented, multi-faceted personality with experience in entrepreneurship, fine arts and martial arts, Ms Gitanjali's first tryst with the education sector in 2015 saw her heading the Cambridge School in Chennai. During this time, Gitanjali gained a great deal of exposure to the education system and its practices in the country, which left her unimpressed. She believed that a lot more could be done in teaching indigenous knowledge, raising student-teacher engagement and learning through experience; and this soon led her to the Himalayan Institute of Alternative Learning in Ladakh. Relocating to Ladakh as a founding member and CEO of this unique Institute, Gitanjali has developed the university's curriculum to provide local solutions to real-life problems, thereby benefitting the wider community. She has also set up an initiative called 'Peaceful Warriors' with the objective of making every girl in India a black belt in karate. Using her numerous skills, Gitanjali has contributed immensely to setting up the Himalayan Institute of Alternative Learning, which as the world's first 'Doer's University', is indeed paving the way for a new system of education by integrating the ancient wisdom of India with the modern, practical techniques of today.



Mr Jayant Kapatker Founder and CEO - STAM Interactive Solutions Inc., India

ayant Kapatker graduated as an Engineer from Indian Institute of Technology, Kanpur and has a MBA from Faculty of Management Studies, Delhi University. As the Founder and CEO of STAM Interactive Solutions Inc., he conducts online training courses on Security Technology, and this has won him the prestigious 'Judges Choice Award' at the International Security Conference, Las Vegas.


His main passion has been to assimilate the teaching of *vedānta* in his daily life. For over 15 years, he has attended vedanta and bhagavad gita classes at the Arsha Bodha Centre, New Jersey. During this exciting journey, he has seen many connections between science and vedānta. In 2014, he began writing essays to show how the teachings of *vedānta* can contribute to adding a new dimension to the scientific understanding of the universe.

r Benjamin Zenk is Instructor of Management in the College of Business and Economics at the University of Hawai'i at Hilo in the United States, where he teaches critical thinking, business ethics, environmental ethics, and introductory business. Dr Zenk also works with the University's Department of Philosophy where he covers topics on philosophy, ethics, reasoning, symbolic logic, histories of Indian and Buddhist philosophy, and comparative philosophy. He received his PhD in Philosophy from the University of Hawai'i at Mānoa in 2018 on the topic of 'Cross-cultural philosophical disagreement.' Prior to this, he received a Master's Degree in Philosophy from the University of Hawai'i at Mānoa and a Bachelor's Degree in Philosophy from Loyola Marymount University (LMU). Dr Zenk utilises a broad array of cross-cultural and interdisciplinary materials in his business and management courses, stemming from his studies of world philosophy, logic, and ethics, as well as both German and Sanskrit language and literature. His work has led to many months of language and cultural research and study, in Germany and India.



Swami Anubhavananda Founder – Sat Bhavana Trust, India

wami Anubhavananda is a renowned exponent of Indian wisdom and a wellknown vedāntic Master. He spreads the message of 'Be Happy.' He urges everyone to live in an inspired mode throughout their lives and be spiritual by observing sincere devotion, positive thinking, expression of joy and zero complaints.

Swami Anubhavananda has been a teacher (an *āchārya*) at the Sandeepany Sadhanalaya at Powai (Mumbai) – a Post Graduate Academy for vedāntic Studies. Swami Anubhavananda is famous for his active and informative discourses on the bhagavad gītā, the upanişads, patañjali yoga sutras, śrīmad bhāgavatam, pañchadaśī, tripura rahasya, amrutānubhav and more. He has conducted various camps for adults and children titled 'Mauj Mein Raho.'



Geshe Lodoe Sangpo Tenzin Gyatso Scholar – Gaden Jangtse Monastery, India

eshe Lodoe Sangpo was born in Tibet and came to India in 1992. He enrolled in Gaden Jangtse Monastery and studied Buddhist philosophy for more than 20 years. After completing the monastic curriculum, he took the board exam of Geshe Lharampa Degree for six years and obtained the degree in 2018. He also completed one year of Tantric study at Gyuto Monastery. In addition to this, Geshe Lodoe Sangpo had great exposure to science education, as he was one of the first Tenzin Gyatso Scholars who got the opportunity to study science at Emory University for three years. After graduating from Emory University, he has primarily been teaching science to the monastics. He served as coordinator and translator for the Emory-Tibet Science Initiative, which is a summer science programme, for six years at Gaden Monastery. Presently, he is serving as supervisor of Unit B Thukdam project and science teacher of Gaden Jangtse Monastery.



Ms Gulshaa Begum Chairperson – Divine Abode Foundation, India

s Gulshaa Begum hails from a family of Sufi saints and is the direct descendant of Hazrat Khawaja Gul Mohammad Sha Sabri Chishti (R.A.), who moved from the northern frontiers of Afghanistan to South Canara district, Karnataka. A mystic, clairvoyant, healer and an artist, she has been blessed with a series of visions and transcendental experiences through the process of kundalini awakening. The Divine Goddess initiated her on the spiritual path and taught her the Vedas, Quran, Bible, Torah, Healing, Painting, Science, Writing, History and many more. She has extensively promoted inter-faith harmony through her various initiatives, conferences, and programmes to build a culture of peace and also undertakes innumerable service activities towards improving the infrastructure and facilities at Government schools. Gulshaa Begum is also the director of the Annual International Sufi Festival at Ajmer and Delhi and Chairperson of the Divine Abode Foundation, Kamaluddin Charitable Trust and Al Ikhlas Museum and Gallery. She currently resides in Ajmer.

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Dr A K Merchant General Secretary – Temple of Understanding India Foundation

r A K Merchant is the General Secretary, Temple of Understanding India Foundation (a global interfaith association). He also serves as National Trustee, Sarvodaya International Trust; President, Mintra Foundation (resource centre for waste plastics management); Associate Secretary, Global Warming Reduction Centre; and Visiting Faculty, Centre for Cultural Resources and Training, Ministry of Culture, Government of India. He is also a subject expert for research scholars enrolled for 'interfaith education and Indian culture' of the Jawaharlal Nehru Memorial Fund; and a Naturopath and Counsellor for Positive Psychotherapy. He is an active member of the Bahá'í Faith since 1975 and continues to hold administrative positions by serving the Spiritual Assembly of the Bahá'ís of Delhi and National Spiritual Assembly of the Bahá'ís of India.

Dr Merchant has represented the Temple of Understanding, as well as the Bahá'í Community of India at numerous international and national conferences, symposia and seminars in India and abroad since 1985 until 2008. He was invited to address the eighth Asian Buddhist Conference for Peace, September 1990, held in Ulaanbaatar, Mongolia on the subject 'Youth and the Interfaith Movement-Challenges and Opportunities from the viewpoint of the Bahá'í Faith.'
